Good News Reflection

How to handle fakers

In this Sunday's Gospel reading, Jesus addresses the problem of fakers, i.e., people who try to win his friendship by being religious and showing up for the banquet of the Eucharist (Mass) while refusing to enter into a genuine relationship with God.

You know the type: They are friendly as long as it works to their own advantage. They do good deeds but only when it's convenient. They perform Catholic rituals perfectly during Mass but at home they don't even take time to pray. Their faith is so shallow that distractions easily keep them away from Mass. When a priest sins, they leave Catholicism. When their relationship with you requires sacrifice or repentance, they abandon you.

Those who have a genuine relationship with God are identified by the presence of God's love within them radiating outward and blessing others, especially when it's not easy to love.

Jesus shows us in today's parable how to handle the fakers. The invitation to join the party is open to everyone, but when people want only the fun of being a child of God and they ignore the hard work of sharing his love with others, God sets up boundaries against them.

Think of the people you've invited to your banquet table, i.e., into a healthy, Godly relationship, but they've tried to reshape it according to their unhealthiness and immorality. We should love them but not within harmful circumstances. We should do our own part to make the relationship healthy, but when others do not do their part, they've already abandoned the relationship.

God asks us to carry the cross of doing everything possible to invite them to repentance, conversion, and healing. However, healthy boundaries need to remain in place, and when our efforts are fruitless, eventually God says it's time to let go and move on.

And always, we're to go back out into the byroads to find those who genuinely value Godly friendships.

St. John Bosco's relics at Guardian Angels this Thursday

The **relic statue of St John Bosco**, better known as Don Bosco, is **coming to our parish on** <u>Thursday!</u> This is a wonderful opportunity for us to get to know one of the Church's saints, venerate his relics, and ask for his intercession in our lives.

The relic is touring Australia as part of the celebrations of the centenary of the arrival of the Salesians on Australian soil. The Salesians are the Order that he founded in Italy in the 1800s.



Life of St John Bosco (1815-1888)

St. John Bosco, born August 16, 1815 in Becchi, Italy. He died January 31 1888. He was made a Saint by the Catholic Church April 1 1934 and his Feast Day is celebrated every year on January 31. He started the Salesian Order and was a pioneer of educating the poor and marginalised in society.

John Bosco was born during a drought and famine in a time of reconstruction, following the end of the Napoleonic Wars. His father died when he was two years old, leaving his devoutly Catholic mother to raise him and his two elder brothers in poverty as basic farmers and shepherds.

As a young boy, he saw the performance of a traveling circus troupe and began to teach himself magic tricks and acrobatics. He would gather groups of other children for his little shows and would recite a recent homily, prayer, or hymn at the end.

He felt called to the priesthood but lacked the necessary education. He eventually found a priest who helped him with some basic education, but his dream was harshly received by one of his brothers. Bosco left home at the age of 12 and worked odd jobs as a farm labourer until he came into the care of the future Saint Joseph Cafasso, who helped to further his education at the seminary and taught him about the spirituality of St. Francis of Sales.

What are Relics?

In Catholic Christianity, a relic is of immense reverence, and helps to remind individuals of the holiness of a saint, and the fulfillment of God's work through the saint. A relic can consist of anything from the bones of a saint to an object that the saint came in contact with during his or her lifetime. The relic that is visiting us is from Don Bosco's mortal remains and is encased in a life-like wax statue.

Program at Guardian Angels on Thursday

4pm: Liturgy for Welcoming the Relic

5pm: <u>Votive Mass</u> in honour of St John Bosco 6pm: Rosary honouring Our Lady, Help of Christians

7pm: Conclusion and blessing

In between the times of formal prayers above, there will be the opportunity for personal prayer and veneration of the relic.

Religious Use of Relics

- •A long time ago Christians began visiting sites where a holy person lived or died.
- •This tradition continues today where people travel to a sacred site.
- •Not everyone could easily travel to visit the sites of relics in the past, so parts of the saint or clothing owned by the saint were taken to other places so people didn't have to travel to honour the saint and pray for their help.
- •Relics connect us to saints who are praying for us because of their connection to God.
- By being close to a relic it allows us to prayerfully connect with the Saint and with God.
- •To venerate a relic means to show a sign of respect to a relic and say a prayer.

How to Venerate a Relic

There are many ways that you can venerate a relic:

- Touch the case that houses the relic.
- •Make the sign of the cross.
- •Kneel in front of the relic in prayer.
- •Bow your head towards the relic.
- Quietly say a prayer to ask Jesus and John Bosco to help you, or someone you know.
- •Touch a prayer card or other objects to the relic.


